SCENIC BOAT TOURS

The most popular way to see the islands is aboard a boat cruise! Tours depart throughout the day to cruise visitors past fairytale castles, stately mansions and historic lighthouses. Tour boats zig-zag among the islands while guides entertain with true stories of pirates and bootleggers and point out homes owned by titans of industry and secret societies.

Cruises range from 1 to 5 hours; some include stops at Boldt Castle, Singer Castle and Rock Island Lighthouse.

You can pair your sightseeing cruise with a luncheon or dining excursion or enjoy a twilight tour that includes tastings by local wine and beer producers.



Be sure to check for themed-party cruises, fireworks outings and other special tours throughout the season.

Fall is a popular time to cruise because visitors are treated to a "mirrored-effect" of colorful fall foliage from the islands reflecting off the water. Cruising season fluctuates depending on weather but most tour companies start in late April and wrap-up in November.



BOLDT CASTLE

ew York City hotelier George Boldt (Waldorf-Astoria) built this six-story, 120-room mansion as a gift to his beloved wife Louise at the turn of the century.

Her untimely death left the dream unfulfilled and the castle lay abandoned for nearly a century. The stunning restoration of the castle and other island structures has topped more than \$45 million and leaves visitors-many who come back annually to see the progress-in awe.

Visitors can also tour the Boldt Yacht House, home to a collection of antique boats including several owned by the Boldt family. A shuttle boat ferries passengers between Boldt Castle and the Yacht House every 30 minutes.

SINGER CASTLE

Built by the Bourne Family of Singer Sewing Machine fame, the castle was designed as an island retreat. Guided tours of this four-story, 28-room mansion include secret passageways and a glimpse into American history.

The Royal Suite is available for overnight booking! Enjoy a 45-minute guided tour of the grounds and castle; check with boat tour operators for transportation or dock with your own watercraft.







1000 Islands Rideau Canal Waterways

ST. LAWRENCE RIVER WATERFRONT, ONTARIO

lan your adventure in the 1000 Islands Rideau Canal region with its internationally known landscapes. Cruise the 1,864 islands or navigate the 202-km/ 125-mile passageway through 47 locks as part of Ontario's only UNESCO World Heritage Destination. It is an outdoor playground for boating, paddling, fishing, hiking, picnicking, wildlife watching, waterside camping and golfing amongst a historic backdrop.

The 1000 Islands Parkway that runs parallel to the river, offers a scenic 40-km / 25-mile drive with a separate double-lane paved path for cycling enthusiasts. Along the way, you will find Brown's Bay Park with a new beach, playground, picnic areas and a canteen. Also is Thousands Islands National Park with trails, waterside and island camping and picnicking. Outlets for trekking, zip lining and scuba diving are a part of the recreational fun.

Island views from above are offered by 1000 Islands Helicopter tours and the 1000 Islands Tower. To get up close to the islands, castles, and the mansions, take a cruise with departures leaving from Rockport, Ivy Lea, Gananoque, and Brockville.

The Rideau Canal Waterway, North America's longest-operating canal system is a 19th century canal, a National Historic Site of Canada and an engineering marvel with original military blockhouses. The slack waters of the canal provide calm water for family paddling and houseboat rentals. Enjoy small-town hospitality and unique boutique shopping in Westport, Newboro and Merrickville. •


















Lighthouses

The lighthouses of the 1000 Islands once played pivotal roles in the safe passage of commercial, military and recreational boats through the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario. Today they stand as a nostalgic callback to this region's nautical history. You will find lighthouses accessible by automobile or foot along the shoreline as well as by tour boat or personal watercraft. The lighthouses are in varying states of accessibility – some you can walk the interior iron stairs to the lantern rooms – and each has a unique design to be enjoyed by lighthouse buffs and casual observers.

Boat tour passengers and private vessels should keep an eye and ear open – and a camera handy – to learn the history of each of these stoic towers. Some have been retired while others are still illuminated at night to assist boaters on their way. The lighthouses of the St. Lawrence River and Lake Ontario – part of the St. Lawrence Seaway connecting the Great Lakes with the Atlantic Ocean – were essential to providing safe passage for early boaters and travelers. We encourage all of today's visitors to not only take in their beauty but learn their importance in the 1000 Islands.

Chaumont-Three Mile Bay

/ elcome to the Chaumont-Three Mile Bay area located on the eastern end of Lake Ontario known as the "Golden Crescent." Chaumont Bay harbors some of the best family fishing on the continent! It is the largest freshwater bay in the world!

A unique bay with Point Peninsula and Pillar Point providing the entrance, it has rocky shores, varying water depths, weed and rocky covered bottoms, and good shoals for spawning. Its murky depths provide some of the liveliest, mouthwatering pan-frying bass, pickerel, perch, pike, bullhead, lake trout and salmon.

Sailing in the Golden Crescent is second to none, featuring two of the finest yacht clubs in the country. Local marinas provide the boat owner with sales and service for all of their needs. Bait is sold locally at marinas and the hardware store. Shop locally at the Chaumont Country Store, wine and spirits, gift shops and don't

forget about the Cottage Bakery & Gift Shop by the isthmus! Antique store in Three Mile Bay with many treasures. Our local farmers are selling fresh produce, honey and meats year-round.


Devoid of heavy commercialism, areas of Chaumont Bay offer relaxation, swimming, fishing, biking, walking trails, boating and camping. Winter sports include ice fishing, cross country skiing and snowmobiling. A two-mile nature trail at the Chaumont Barrens takes the hiker through a mosaic of rare habitats and a unique alvar landscape unlike any other natural area in the Northeastern United States.

Clayton brought in luxury with the 1000 Islands Harbor Hotel, an upscale Four Diamond Rated AAA hotel perched along the St. Lawrence River. With the ambiance of a classic maritime village, Henderson Harbor is an ideal take-off spot for virtually every kind of freshwater recreation which offers sport fishing, ice fishing, charter fishing, motor boating, waterskiing, sailing, surfing, kayaking, scuba diving, and so much more!

Launching a boat is easy with 3 launch sites; Westcott Beach State Park, Henderson Town Boat Launch and the Stony Creek Boat Launch.

There are 8 Marinas offering covered boat slips, boat repair and boat fuel. Henderson Harbor is a popular safe harbor for traveling boaters and sailors during inclement weather. Henderson is well known for its water recreation. but this area also offers a multitude of opportunities for recreation on land as well.





What makes an island?

We actually have 1,864 islands in the "Thousand Islands."

To become part of that count, an island must meet two criteria: it must be above water 365 days a year and it must support a living tree.

The smallest is Tom Thumb Island, located just upriver - or west - of the Canadian span of the Thousand Islands Bridge. With just one tree and only a few square feet staying above water all year, Tom Thumb barely makes the cut.

No island is divided by the international border, meaning each is either wholly within the United States or Canada. That causes the international border to zig-zag across the water instead of forming a straight line between the two counties.

In some places along the St. Lawrence River, islands that are very close are in different counties. Each island has its own individuality with features such as stately granite cliffs, soft sand bays, tall dark pines and vibrant maple trees. It's a sightseer's paradise.

Most islands are privately owned; accommodations range from modern mansions harkening back to the region's time as a playground for the wealthy to modest fishing and hunting camps.

So if someone asks, remember two things: above water all year and at least one tree. Anything less is just a shoal.



Watertown NEW YORK

he city of Watertown is the urban center of Northern New York, with the modern conveniences of national chain stores. restaurants and hotels co-existing with a healthy community of independent shopping, locally owned restaurants and recreational services that provide local flair and a friendly atmosphere.



ocated just south of the 1000 Islands, the Tug Hill region is considered New York State's last untouched wilderness. The Tug Hill is a vast mix of thick forests, valley farmland, gorges, scenic waterfalls and flowing rivers that offer a one-of-a-kind outdoor experience.

Few people live within the Tug Hill's 2,100 square miles, meaning there are sparse crowds, hardly any traffic and no waiting in lines. Dozens of hiking trails snake through the region, perfect for hiking, snowshoeing, mountain biking and just breathing in nature. The waterways are prime for adventurous kayakers, canoe paddling and – in some places – swimming and boating.


